

# **Keep Records!**

In order to fulfill your responsibility for planning your education, you should keep an up-to-date academic portfolio containing the following kinds of information:

- quarterly grade reports and unofficial transcripts that show progress toward your objective;
- transcripts from all schools attended and the UCSC Transfer Credit Summary if you are a transfer student;
- test results from entrance exams, language exams, placement exams, and advanced placement;
- copies of communications to and from the university, such as Proposed Study Plan and Declaration of Major/Minor, petitions, evaluations, and financial aid documents, among others;
- names, addresses, and phone numbers of advisers and faculty members for reference. Include important office numbers as well;
- the UCSC General Catalog, Schedule of Classes, and The Navigator;
- statements of account showing registration, housing, and other charges and payments.

You are responsible for responding to all communications sent to you by the university. Check the Student Portal and your UCSC e-mail account often.

# FINAL EXAMINATION POLICIES AND SCHEDULE

In keeping with Academic Senate Policy, final examinations are required of all undergraduate courses unless the department or course sponsoring agency has obtained permission from the Committee on Educational Policy (CEP) to evaluate students in another manner. When finals are administered, they must be completed within a previously announced time limit. Examinations in non-laboratory courses may not exceed three hours' duration.

The examination schedule is printed in this schedule so that you may plan your finals before you enroll in courses. You are responsible for preventing schedule conflicts. If you show up late for an examination, the instructor may bar you from taking it. You may not be able to retake an examination. If you miss an examination due to illness or other emergency, the instructor may agree to give you an "Incomplete" and schedule a makeup examination if your work is passing up to that point.

Examinations are normally not required in laboratory courses or their equivalent, as individually determined by the CEP. A department may, however, require a final examination in any laboratory course.

## Time and Room

Final examinations are given during exam week at the time announced in the *Schedule of Classes*, in the same room used for class meetings during the quarter.

## **Closed Week**

No final examinations, tests, or significant quizzes, other than laboratory exams or makeup exams, may be given during the last week of instruction.

# Religious Observance

Given the diversity of religious practice within the campus community, academic and administrative units are encouraged to make reasonable accommodation when the schedule of a required campus event conflicts with an individual's religious creed.

It is the official policy of the University of California at Santa Cruz to accommodate without penalty requests for alternate examination times in cases where the scheduled time for the examination violates a student's religious creed.

Requests for accommodation for religious observance should be made directly to the faculty member in charge of the course within the first two weeks of the term or as soon as possible after an examination date is announced. Faculty are expected to make reasonable accommodation for such requests. Students who are unable to reach a satisfactory arrangement with an instructor should consult the head of the unit sponsoring the course or the campus ombudsman.

# Modifications for Reasons of Disability

Students with verifiable disabilities that require examination modifications will be accommodated in compliance with state and federal laws. This includes students with mobility, hearing, and vision impairments, as well as those with learning disabilities, psychological disorders, and other functional impairments. If requested by a student with a disability, DRC personnel will determine whether modifications are necessary. Students are encouraged to make test-taking arrangements directly with the instructor.

# **Early Examinations and Exemptions**

Faculty members are not required to grant special examination privileges in order to allow students to leave before the close of quarter, but may do so in extraordinary circumstances. When a final examination is one of the regular requirements in a course, no one taking the course may be individually exempted from it. If you find it impossible to report for a final examination at the scheduled time because of illness or other unavoidable circumstances, inform the instructor; and see if another time can be arranged.

#### **Take-Home Examinations**

If a take-home examination is not assigned until the week designated for final exams, it cannot require more than three hours to complete.



Meeting campus deadlines is your responsibility. If your fees are paid by your parent or another third party, give that person advance notice of the March 19 fee payment deadline.

#### New! The bill is in the mail and on the web

If you need extra time to prepare your payment, or, for any reason, if you do not receive your billing statement, it is now viewable on the Student Portal. Use the Monthly Statement link to view the statement showing your spring fees beginning March 2. (The statement on the portal is a snapshot of the statement that is mailed; it is not updated during the month.)

#### Allow time for arrival

# **Accessing TELESLUG**

TELESLUG is the name of UCSC's web and telephone enrollment system. TELESLUG is available seven days a week, from 7 A.M. to 8 P.M. (Weekend hours are subject to change.)

#### Web

To access TELESLUG on the web, go to students.ucsc.edu.

#### Phone

Call TELESLUG at (831) 459-SLUG(7584) using a touch-tone phone. If you are calling from outside the 831 or 408 area codes, you may use (800) 459-7584.

# **Student Identification Number (SID)**

Your SID is, in most cases, the same as your Social Security number.

# **About your PIN**

Initially, your 4-digit Personal Identification Number (PIN) is set to your month and day of birth (e.g., if your birthday is January 6, your PIN would be 0106). At the time of your first transaction on TELESLUG, you will be required to enter a new PIN. Please have your new PIN ready at the time of your

first transaction. You may select any four numbers as your new PIN. You may also change your PIN on TELESLUG at any time after your first transaction.

# PIN confidentiality

It is extremely important that your PIN remains confidential. DO NOT GIVE IT TO ANYONE. If you forget your PIN, go to the Office of the Registrar, 190 Hahn Student Services. Requests to obtain your PIN must be made in person, and photo identification is required.

# Appointment Schedule— Priority Enrollment

If you cannot determine the reason for the discrepancy in your appointment time, you should contact the Help Line.

# **TELESLUG Menu Options**

# Action Code 1 (List Grades)

Select this option to list your grades from a prior quarter. Courses which are not yet graded will not be included.

# Action Code 2 (Add Classes)

Select this option to add classes. Students who entered UCSC fall 2001 and after will be enrolled for a letter grade. Students who entered UCSC prior to fall 2001 will choose a grading option. After you have completed your add, TELESLUG will confirm your enrollment. If you do not receive confirmation, there may be one or more reasons:

If you receive the message, "This course has prerequisites or restrictions you do not satisfy," please see Prerequisites and Restrictions information on page 19.

If you receive the message, "This class is closed," there are no more seats available; and the class is full. You must attend the first day of class to see if any seats have become available.

If you receive the message informing you that you must enroll in an associated secondary discussion section or lab, you should enter the call number for your choice of section or lab. (Phone users: DO NOT enter the pound sign again.) Remember that the discussion section or lab is a noncredit activity listed directly below the lecture of the class (i.e., the discussion section for CHEM-001A-01 could be CHEM-001A-01C; it would not be CHEM-001L-01, a 2-credit lab).

If a permission code is required to add a class, be sure to enter the 5-digit call number, the 4-digit permission code, and then the pound sign (#) on the phone or press return (on the web). For more information, look under the Permission Codes section on page 20.

# Action Code 3 (Drop Classes)

Select this option to drop a class. TELESLUG will confirm the drop by stating, "You have been dropped from <course ID>. . . . "

## Action Code 4 (Exchange Classes)

Select this option to exchange one class for another. The exchange function guarantees that you will not lose your seat in a class that you are already enrolled in if you cannot get into the course you wish to add. Enter the call number of the class you are adding and then the pound sign (#) on the phone, or press return (on the web). Students who entered UCSC fall 2001 and after will be enrolled for a letter grade. Students who entered UCSC prior to fall 2001 will choose a grading option. Then you will be prompted to enter the call number of the class you want to drop. (Phone users: DO NOT enter the pound sign again.) You should receive confirmation that you have been enrolled in the new course and dropped from the other. If you receive a different message, check the applicable section under Action Code 2.

If a secondary discussion section is involved in either the add or drop of the exchange, TELESLUG will not be able to process the exchange. Call the Help Line at 459-3939 for assistance in completing the transaction. For more information on secondary courses and exchanges, see Secondary Discussion Sections/Labs on page 19.

You do not have to use the exchange function if you are using a permission code. You can drop your unwanted class first and then add the class using the permission code. After instruction begins, this will NOT work if dropping the class takes you below your minimum credits (see Enrolling after Instruction Begins, page 20, and Minimum/Maximum Credits, page 19).

# Action Code 5 (Grading Option)

Select this option to request or drop the letter-grade or Pass/No Pass option by the quarterly deadline. You must already be enrolled in the course before you can change the grade option. You should be aware that a few courses at UCSC are not available for a letter grade (see Pass/No Pass Only Classes, page 28). Remember that you must elect (or drop) the letter grade by the quarterly deadline. One-time exceptions may be granted. See the Academic and Administrative Calendar on pages 6–7 for deadline dates.

## Action Code 6 (List Schedule)

Select this option for a list of the courses in which you are already enrolled. Your courses will be confirmed by course ID, the day and time they are held, and grade option chosen. When all your courses have been listed, TELESLUG will conclude the list with the total number of credits you are attempting. You can list your entire schedule anytime TELESLUG is available.

You will receive printed confirmation of your schedule at the start of each quarter (see Enrollment Verification and Validation, page 20). It is important that you verify your enrollments before quarterly deadlines have passed (see Enrolling After Instruction Begins on page 20).

# Action Code 7 (List Open Sections)

Select this option for a list of open sections for a course. To search for open sections, enter the call number of one of the sections (not the call number of the lecture). Up to four sections will be listed by section number, call number, day, and time. Press 1, or hit return to list four more open sections.

# Action Code 8 (Change PIN)

Select this option whenever you wish to change your 4-digit PIN. The number you select should be one that is easy for you to remember. In order to protect the confidentiality of your academic record, you should select numbers other than your month and day of birth.


# Action Code 9 (Terminate Session)

Select this option to terminate your enrollment session. You will receive a message about where and when you can obtain a copy of an Enrollment Verification and Validation (EVV). TELESLUG will disconnect at the end of this message.

# Getting back to the main menu

When you select an action code (except 1, 6, or 9), you remain in that function until you choose to return to the main menu by pressing "\*0" on the phone or by entering 9 and hitting return on the web.

# **Student Responsibility**

You are responsible for ensuring the accuracy of your enrollments. Your instructors, academic advisers, and the Office of the Registrar cannot enroll on your behalf. Be sure to verify your courses and grade options prior to the enrollment deadlines listed in the Academic and Administrative Calendar on pages 6–7.

# **Get Prepared**

Use the following helpful hints to assist you in completing your enrollment. It is recommended that you consult with your academic preceptor or major adviser prior to selecting your classes.

- 1. Consult this *Schedule of Classes*. Check the listing of courses offered this quarter, and make some preliminary selections. Updated information can be found in the online schedule at reg.ucsc.edu/soc/.
- 2. Use the Schedule Planner found in this Schedule of Classes. With your preliminary selections of courses, complete the planner, making sure the courses you have selected do not conflict with each other or with any other time commitments (i.e., work or extracurricular activities).
- 3. Enter the 5-digit call numbers for your courses into the Schedule Planner. Make sure to have call numbers for mandatory sections and alternates in case the section is full.

Completing the above steps will enable you to complete your enrollment on TELESLUG within the 10-minute time limit. You will receive a three-minute warning and will be allowed to finish your last transaction before TELESLUG disconnects you.

# **Holds on Enrollment**

A hold may be placed on your enrollment for various reasons including unpaid debts, junior standing without a declared a major, and others. For more information on which unit placed the hold, log on to the Student Portal at *students.ucsc.edu*.

# **Minimum/Maximum Credits**

# Standard course loads for UCSC students

Undergraduate students are expected to take a minimum of 15 credits and may enroll in up to 19 credits. Graduate students are expected to enroll in at least 10 credits and no more than 19 credits. If you wish to take a nonstandard course load, meet with your college academic preceptor or graduate adviser. He or she will make sure the new credit limit is entered into the system so that TELESLUG will allow you to go below 15 or over 19 credits.

## When minimum credits are enforced

Prior to the start of instruction, minimum credits are not enforced to reduce difficulties in processing ex-

changes. Once instruction begins, TELESLUG will not allow you to drop below minimum credits unless you obtain approval from your academic preceptor or graduate adviser. Financial aid recipients should be cautious; certain aid will not be disbursed if enrollment is less than full-time.

# When maximum credits are enforced

TELESLUG will not allow you to enroll in more than 19 credits prior to the first day of instruction. Once instruction begins, TELESLUG will allow you to go above the maximum allowed credits (19 for both undergraduates and graduates) only when you have obtained approval from your academic preceptor or graduate adviser.

# **Call Numbers**

Every course has a 5-digit call number which is used for enrollment. The call number appears in the first column in the *Schedule of Classes* and should be used to enroll via TELESLUG. In some cases, a course may not have a call number listed.

- If a course is available by interview only, you
  will see \*... in the column instead of the call
  number. To enroll in one of these courses, read
  the section, Enrollment Conditions for
  Interview Only, page 11. Obtain the call number from the instructor or department; then,
  enroll via TELESLUG.
- If a course is listed in the schedule with a "V" in the "Prereq" column, it is available by petition only and will not have a call number. To enroll in this class, you must obtain a petition for independent study at the department, college, or division office. The sponsoring agency will assign a call number, and you must enroll via TELESLUG.

# **Prerequisites and Restrictions**

- A course that has a prerequisite means that other courses must be completed or a placement exam must be satisfied before the course can be taken. Courses in which a "D," "F," "NP," "W," or "I" is received do not satisfy prerequisite requirements.
- A course that has restrictions means that the class is available only to certain categories of students.

TELESLUG will check your UCSC academic history to determine if you meet a course prerequisite. Refer to Reading the *Schedule of Classes*, page 44, or to the *UCSC General Catalog* to verify how to fulfill a prerequisite or restriction.

# Prerequisites satisfied at other institutions

If you believe course work completed at another institution satisfies a prerequisite, contact the department sponsoring the course. The department may require either your transcript from your previous

institution or your UCSC Transfer Credit Summary Sheet (TCSS) as evidence that you satisfied the prerequisite.

# **Secondary Discussion Sections/Labs**

# What is a secondary discussion section/lab?

A section is a smaller discussion group or lab class which is not for credit and is taken as part of a credit course. Secondary sections are always listed directly below the main lecture. Not all secondary sections require enrollment on TELESLUG.

#### When must you enroll in a section?

You must enroll in a section when a note appears below the lecture course indicating that enrollment in a section is required. For instance, the secondary section for CHEM-001C-01 is required (see Reading the *Schedule of Classes*, page 44).

In addition, the secondary discussion sections/labs will have call numbers listed next to them. You must enroll in both the lecture and required secondary section, or TELESLUG will not allow you to enroll in either part of the course.

*Note:* if there is no call number listed, you do not enroll via TELESLUG. You will be assigned a section at the first class meeting.

# Search for open sections

For a list of open sections, choose the "search for open sections" option via TELESLUG. Enter the call number of one of the sections (not the call number of the lecture).

## Exchanging courses with sections

If you wish to exchange courses, and one of the courses involved has a required section, you must call the Help Line at 459-3939 for assistance in making the exchange.

# **Exchanging sections**

After instruction begins, it is not possible to exchange sections on TELESLUG. You may attend a different section with approval from the instructor and/or teaching assistant (TA). DO NOT DROP a required secondary discussion section unless you want to drop the class.

# When the lecture or sections are closed (full)

If there is space in the lecture, but you cannot find an open section, you cannot enroll in the class. If sections have space, but the lecture is closed, you cannot enroll in the class. If you have a permission code for the lecture, and all the sections are full, call the Help Line at 459-3939 for assistance.

# **Concurrent Enrollment**

A "Y" flag exists in the "Conc. En." column if it is recommended or required that you enroll in another course for credit during the same quarter that you enroll in this course. Check the note in the schedule

to determine the course in which you should also enroll. For example, if you enroll in CHEM-001B-01, you should concurrently enroll in the associated lab, which is CHEM-001M-01. TELESLUG will prompt you to enroll in the concurrent course. This message will be read even if you ARE enrolled in the concurrent course; it is a reminder.

The term, "concurrent enrollment," can be confusing. Please note:

- it is not the same as a discussion section (see Secondary Discussion Sections/Labs above):
- it is not the same as concurrent enrollment through UC Extension, in which a person enrolls in a regular UCSC course as an Extension student.

# **Permission Codes**

A permission code is a four-digit number which guarantees you admission to a course. It is specific to a course and can be used only once. **To obtain a permission code**, consult with the instructor or department.

# When are permission codes valid?

Students may begin to use permission codes the first day of open enrollment. Permission codes are required after the eighth day of instruction.

## Which courses DO NOT have permission codes?

"Interview Only" and Individual Studies classes do not require permission codes—only the five-digit call number. There are no permission codes for secondary discussion sections.

#### What a permission code can override

A permission code will override course restrictions and/or prerequisites, and it will override the closed (full) status of a course.

## What a permission code CANNOT override

Permission codes cannot override time conflicts, your maximum allowed units, or the need to wait until the day after the first class meeting to enroll.

# If you have a problem with your permission code

You may encounter a problem if another student has used the code or if you were given a code for the wrong section of a course (i.e., for SPAN-001-01 instead of SPAN-001-02). Check with the person who issued you the code to make sure that none of these circumstances have occurred. If you have any further problems, contact the Help Line at 459-3939.

# **Time Conflicts**

# Why you might have a time conflict

If there is ANY overlap in time with a course you are trying to add, TELESLUG will tell you "this course has a time conflict with <course ID>" and will not enroll you. Courses which have the same start and end times are considered a time conflict. If the

Schedule of Classes does not indicate a time conflict, but TELESLUG tells you there is one, then the days and/or times of one or both of the courses have changed. You should contact the department to find out when the courses are being offered, or check online at reg.ucsc.edu/soc for the most up-to-date information.



# How to resolve a time conflict

If your courses overlap, but you believe that you can complete both courses in spite of the conflict, you should call the Help Line at 459-3939 for assistance in adding the course.

Time conflicts cannot be resolved with a permission code, as the permission code cannot override a time barrier.

# **Technical Difficulties**

The technical difficulties message indicates that an error in entry has been made. TELESLUG will also give you this message if you press an unexpected key at any time.

# What to do when you get this message

If you hear this message while you are enrolling in a class with a section, check the *Schedule of Classes* to make certain you are keying in the information correctly. You should also check that you are using the proper call numbers. If you are positive that you are entering the information correctly, and you still get the technical difficulties message, you should call the Help Line at 459-3939 for assistance.

# **Enrollment Verification and Validation (EVV)**

A pink Preliminary EVV will be available in your college office (undergraduates) or department office (graduates) at the beginning of each quarter.

Use this form to confirm your courses, meeting times and locations, and the grade option. Use TELESLUG to make any changes or corrections to your enrollments by the posted enrollment deadlines (see page 12).

This form also validates payment of registration fees. Important messages about your enrollment and registration status will appear on the EVV beneath the box where your classes are listed. Refer to the reverse of the form for a complete explanation of the information provided.

If you lose your EVV, it cannot be reprinted. You may list your schedule via TELESLUG to confirm your enrollments.

# **Retaining Enrollments**

To retain your seat in the courses listed on your EVV, you **must** attend the first class meeting. Instructors **may** administratively drop anyone who does not attend.

# **Enrolling after Instruction Begins**

Attend the first class meeting of any classes you want to add. You must obtain the instructor's permission to add the course. If necessary, the instructor will issue a permission code. You must wait until the day after the first class meeting before enrolling in the course via TELESLUG.

# **Grade Option**

Students have until April 16 to request the letter grade or Pass/No Pass option. Students should verify their grade option in each course by listing their schedule via TELESLUG or checking their Enrollment Verification and Validation form. One-time exceptions to the letter grade deadline may be granted. For spring 2004 courses, request exceptions by May 26. Requests for exceptions must be submitted in person at the Office of the Registrar, and approval is contingent upon agreement of the instructor(s). *Note*: exceptions are granted only to change from Pass/No Pass to a letter grade.

# **Verify Your Enrollments**

It is recommended that you verify your courses and grade options when you complete a transaction via TELESLUG. To do this, use the "List Your Schedule" option from the TELESLUG main menu.



# **Billing Statements**

# Bills Mailed: March 2, 2004

Registration fees and other charges are due and payable upon receipt of the Statement of Account, but no later than March 19, 2004. Graduate registration fees are due no later than April 6, 2004. Financial aid credits are automatically applied unless you owe over \$100 in previous debts or have failed to turn in requested documents (see the Financial Aid section on the following page).

# **Statement of Account Mailing Address**

Statements for spring quarter are mailed to the billing address on file; if no billing address was established, billing statements are mailed to the local address on file. Please update your addresses to ensure timely delivery of statements. Late fees will not be waived due to an incorrect or outdated address.

You may establish a separate billing address or update your local mailing address online at *students. ucsc.edu*. For more information regarding addresses and changing your address, see Address Changes on page 30.

If you do not receive a Statement of Account, you are still responsible for meeting payment deadlines. Statements cannot be reproduced, but you can see a copy of your most recent statement on the Student Portal at *students.ucsc.edu*. If you have questions about your fees, call the Office of the Registrar at (831) 459-4412; or e-mail *registrar@ucsc.edu*. Questions about making the payment are answered by Student Business Services at (831) 459-2107 and (831) 459-2519 or *oarinfo@ucsc.edu*.

# **Payment of Fees**

Deadline to pay registration fees is Friday, March 19, 2004, for undergraduates and Tuesday, April 6, 2004, for graduate students.

Your classes will be dropped, and you will be assessed a \$50 late registration fee if your payment is not received by the cashier by 4 P.M. on the due date. Postmarks will not be used to validate on-time payment.

See the Financial Aid section on the following page if

- you applied for financial aid, but have not been notified of your eligibility; or
- you received your financial aid Offer Letter, but financial aid credits do not appear on your Statement of Account.

If you cannot pay your fees in full by the deadline, sign up for the Deferred Payment Plan (DPP) and pay the first installment by March 19, 2004. Please read about the Deferred Payment Plan for more information.

If you find yourself having to make payment on the due date, you are encouraged to make payment in person to our Cashier's Office to ensure immediate ac-

count credit on the due date. Payments can be made up until 4 P.M. through the cashier's window or up until 3 P.M. through the cashier's depository (located on the north wall in the Hahn Building); all payments received after 4 P.M. are subject to late fees. The campus does not accept credit cards for payment.

Graduate students will be assessed the \$50 late fee if fees are not paid by April 6, 2004. Graduate student enrollments are not dropped for nonpayment.

# **Returned Checks**

If your registration check is returned by the bank, you will be subject to a \$25 returned check fee for the first offense and \$35 for each subsequent returned check and, if applicable, a \$50 late registration fee. You may not enroll for the next quarter if you do not clear the check. Personal checks will not be accepted from students who chronically have checks returned by the bank.

# **Late Registration**

If you pay your fees and enroll after April 6, you will be assessed both the \$50 late registration fee and the \$50 late enrollment fee. April 16 is the last day to register and enroll.

# **Deferred Payment Plan (DPP)**

The Deferred Payment Plan (DPP) provides an alternative method of budgeting and paying registration fees. It allows these fees, to the extent not covered by scholarships, loans, or other financial aid, to be paid in monthly installments. Students have a choice of applying for a three-month plan for an individual

quarter's fees or for a nine-month plan, at the beginning of the fall quarter only, to be used for the fall, winter, and spring quarters. A nonrefundable application fee of \$25 for the three-month plan and \$60 for the nine-month plan is required. Any student in good financial and academic standing may apply for DPP. Students receiving financial aid sufficient to cover registration fees in full are not eligible for this plan. For more information about how to apply for DPP, application deadlines, and campus policies regarding the program, contact the Office of Student Business Services at 203 Hahn Student Services Building, (831) 459-2519, or at oarin@ucsc.edu. # **Nonresident Students**

If you are classified a nonresident for tuition purposes, and you believe that you will be eligible for resident status for spring quarter 2004, petition for change of residence status at the Office of the Registrar prior to paying registration fees. Petitions must be filed before spring quarter begins.

# **Health Insurance**

Campus fees include the Undergraduate Health Insurance Plan (UHIP) Fee. You must either pay the UHIP fee or request its waiver by submitting proof of comparable health insurance to Student Health Services before the waiver deadline. Graduate students may waive the Graduate Health Insurance (GSHIP). Students who do not waive the health insurance fee by the waiver deadline are covered by the UHIP policy and must pay the insurance fee. # **Part-Time Study for Undergraduates**

If you are unable to maintain a full-time program of study because of employment responsibilities, family obligations, or health problems, you may be eligible for a 50 percent reduction in the educational fee and in the nonresident tuition fee (if applicable). To qualify for reduced fees, you must be approved for the Part-Time Program and be enrolled in 10 quarter credits or fewer. If you exceed 10 credits in a quarter, you must pay full fees. The last day to apply for the Part-Time Program for spring quarter 2004 is April 16.

For information regarding the Part-Time Program, call the Office of the Registrar at 459-4412 before the deadline listed in the calendar in this schedule.

# **Financial Aid**

Read the sections below which apply to your circumstances:

# You applied for aid, but have not been notified of your eligibility; or you received a financial aid Offer Letter, but financial aid credits do not appear on your Statement of Account

Log on to the Student Portal to determine why your aid is being held, or contact the Financial Aid Office before the registration deadline to determine what you must do to receive your aid so that you will not be dropped from the classes in which you enrolled. The phone number is 459-2963, and it is answered weekdays between 8 A.M. and 5 P.M. The Financial Aid Office is in 201 Hahn and is open weekdays from 9 A.M. to 4 P.M. (except Fridays, when it opens at 10 A.M. and closes at 2 P.M.). The e-mail address is  $fin_aid@ucsc.edu$ .

# Your financial aid credits have appeared on your Statement of Account

You must use your own resources to pay any balance shown as "Amount Due" at the top of your statement by the deadline in order to keep your place in classes in which you enrolled.

If the amount due on your statement is 0, or if it shows a credit balance, you are not required to take any action. Your EVV form will indicate that your fees are paid.

If your statement has a credit balance, this is the amount we owe you. You must enroll in classes to receive these funds. If you have authorized electronic funds transfer (EFT), the funds will be disbursed directly to your bank account on the first day of the quarter. Otherwise, the check will be mailed to your local address on the first day of the quarter.

# Electronic Funds Transfer of Financial Aid Refunds

Financial aid refunds are offered via Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) or mail only. Sign up for EFT to have your financial aid refunds directly deposited into your personal bank account. EFT assures that students receive their financial aid in the most efficient and direct manner. Notification of direct deposit will be sent to the student's college box. Students are asked to complete an EFT authorization form (see page 23 for a copy of the EFT form) and return it to the Office of Student Business Services (203 Hahn Student Services Building) by March 26, 2004, to guarantee that the EFT will be set up in time for the first disbursement of spring quarter 2004. If EFT has not been authorized, a check will be generated and mailed to the student's local address. Applications are accepted throughout the year at the Office of Student Business Services.

# **Withdrawal During a Quarter**

You may find it necessary to withdraw from UCSC during a quarter. File a Petition for Withdrawal/Leave of Absence at your college office. Return your student ID with your petition. Refunds of any registration fees cannot be made unless your ID card is returned. The effective date for determining a refund of fees is the date the student notifies the college of the withdrawal. It is presumed that no university services are provided to you after withdrawal from the university with the exception of leave of absence benefits (also, see Withdrawal/W grade information on page 27). Graduate students should contact the Division of Graduate Studies.

# Withdrawal and Financial Aid Recipients

A financial aid adviser will receive and process your withdrawal petition. Depending on the withdrawal date, you may be billed for some or all of the aid you received. If you plan to return to UCSC a subsequent

academic year, remember to meet the March 2 and May 1 deadlines each year in order to be considered for all forms of aid available. Students who submit requested documents after May 1 will be packaged on a funds-available basis when all documents have been received. This means that the most desirable funds, such as University Grant and Federal Work-Study, may no longer be available after May 1, 2004. Go to the Financial Aid Office for more information.

# Withdrawal and Deferred Payment Plan

If you contracted for the Deferred Payment Plan (DPP), and you withdraw before completing all your installments, you may still owe registration fees as determined by your date of withdrawal. After filing your withdrawal petition, call the Office of Student Business Services at 459-2519 for more information.

## Refund of Fees

If you withdraw from UCSC after paying your registration fees, the withdrawal may cause an overpayment to your account. Refunds are issued approximately three weeks after the completed petition is filed at the Office of the Registrar. For students who have authorized EFT, the refund is issued in the form of an electronic funds transfer; otherwise, it is mailed to the address indicated on the withdrawal petition.

A full refund of the registration fees will be granted to a student entering the armed forces before the sixth week of the quarter. For UCSC policy on students interrupting studies because of military service, click on the Veteran Services link on the Office of the Registrar's home page at reg.ucsc.edu.

# **Financial Implication of Withdrawal**

Your registration fee assessment will be adjusted as determined by the effective date of the withdrawal. If the effective date is on or before the first day of instruction (see the Academic and Administrative Calendar, pages 6–7), your fees will be adjusted as follows.

- New students: all fees reversed except the nonrefundable \$100 Statement of Intent to Register Fee.
- Continuing and reentering students: all fees reversed except a service charge of \$10.

If the effective date is on or after the first day of instruction, fees will be adjusted according to the following schedule, which refers to the elapsed calendar days beginning with the first day of instruction:

first day of instruction	100%	of assessed fees reversed
2-7 calendar days	90%	of assessed fees reversed
8-18 calendar days	50%	of assessed fees reversed
19-35 calendar days	25%	of assessed fees reversed
36 calendar days and over	0%	of assessed fees reversed

Note: this refund schedule is subject to change.

For new students, the nonrefundable \$100 Statement of Intent to Register Fee is withheld from the University Registration Fee; and the schedule above is applied to the balance of fees assessed. *Note:* there is a different schedule for entering frosh receiving federal financial aid who withdraw during their first quarter. For more information, contact the Office of the Registrar, 459-4412.

# REGISTRATION INFORMATION

# **Leave of Absence**

Any undergraduate student who has completed at least one quarter at UCSC and is withdrawing may request a leave of absence by completing an application available at his or her college office. A leave of absence is defined as a planned interruption in your education and may be granted for up to three quarters. The intent of this service is to make it possible for you to suspend your academic work and eliminate the need to apply for readmission.

Leave of absence status permits you to use many campus services normally reserved for registered stu-

dents. The \$40 leave of absence application fee entitles you to use services available at the offices of the Career Center, Off-Campus Housing, Family Student Housing, and some computer labs, as well as to obtain discounts on transportation and other benefits. Students on leave of absence must contact the CATS Information Resource Center to avoid account closure. The application fee is nonrefundable and nontransferable.

# Readmission

You are encouraged to file your application for readmission as soon as possible and no later than the date in the Academic and Administrative Calendar. The registration fee payment procedure for readmitted students is the same as for continuing students. If you do not get a bill for registration fees, contact the Office of the Registrar at 459-4412 before the fee payment deadline. You are expected to meet the registration deadline.

# **Deferred Payment Plan Application**

The Deferred Payment Plan (DPP) allows your registration fees, to the extent not covered by financial aid, to be paid in monthly installments. To apply for DPP, complete and return this application with the appropriate nonreturnable application fee (see below) to the Office of Student Business Services, 1156 High St., 203 Hahn Student Services, Santa Cruz, CA 95064. The application, fee, and the first installment are due before the quarter begins. DPP applies to registration fees only; health insurance is not included in DPP. # **Pass/No Pass Grading Option**

Students may elect the Pass/No Pass grading option through TELESLUG and may change their grading option in a course via TELESLUG up to the 15th day of instruction. For the Pass/No Pass option, students receive a P for work that is performed at C or clearly passing level or better. For work that is not clearly passing, no academic credit is awarded and students receive a NP (No Pass). Beginning fall 2001, the grade notation NP appears on the official transcript in all cases, regardless of when a student was admitted. For work that is passing, but incomplete, the grade notation I (Incomplete) may be issued.

# **In Progress Notations**

The notation IP (In Progress) is reserved for a single course extending over two or three terms of an academic year. The grade for such a course may be awarded at the end of the course and shall then be recorded as applying to each of the terms of the course. A student satisfactorily completing only one or two terms of a course, extending over two or three terms of an academic year, will be given grades for those terms. The grade option selected in the first quarter of the multiple term sequence applies to all quarters of the sequence.

# **Grade Changes**

Incomplete grade notations of "I" must be changed to final grades, based upon work submitted to the instructor, within the deadline for Incompletes. Other grade changes can be made by the instructor only on the basis of clerical or procedural error, and never on the basis of re-examination or completion of additional work.

# **Accessing Grades by Web and Phone**

You may access your grades for any quarter via TELESLUG. Log on to teleslug.ucsc.edu, or call TELESLUG at 459-SLUG (Monday–Sunday, 7 A.M. to 8 P.M.). Enter your Student Identification Number (SID) and your Personal Identification Number (PIN). Choose "List grades from a previous quarter." Then enter the year and quarter in which you took the class. Grades are usually available about one week after the end of the quarter. They can also be viewed via the Student Portal at students.ucsc.edu.

# **Catalog Rights**

Effective for all those who entered in fall quarter 1993 or after, students may select the *UCSC General Catalog* they will follow to meet their requirements from either the one published at the time of entering UCSC or a subsequent catalog. A student must follow the chosen catalog in its entirety. This applies to UC, college, general education, and major requirements.

Students transferring from other collegiate institutions may elect to meet as graduation requirements one of the following:

- those in effect at the time of transfer to UCSC;
- those subsequently established; or
- those in effect when the student entered a previous collegiate institution, provided that entry was not more than three years prior to the time of transfer to UCSC.

Students who seek readmission to UCSC after a break in attendance greater than two years (six regular quarters) must adhere to the graduation requirements in effect at the time of readmission or those subsequently established.

Students who entered prior to 1993 should see an adviser. Their catalog year for graduation, whether the year they entered UCSC or a subsequent year, will be decided at the discretion of their major department and/or their college.

Your catalog year will initially be set for the year you first enroll at UCSC. You may select another catalog year when you file your Proposed Study Plan/Declaration of Major/Minor. All requirements for graduation outlined in the catalog you select must be met before you can graduate.

To change your catalog year, you must submit a new Proposed Study Plan/Declaration of Major/Minor through your college.

# Undergraduates Who Entered UCSC Prior to fall 1997

Guidelines for undergraduates who entered UCSC between fall 1997 and spring 2001 also apply to undergraduates who entered UCSC prior to fall 1997, with the following exception: those who entered prior to fall 1997 may elect letter grades, but a grade-point average will not be displayed on the official transcript. All undergraduates, regardless of when they entered UCSC, must meet the UC minimum GPA requirement in order to receive a degree from the University of California: 2.0 calculated from all UCSC lettergraded courses and from all letter-graded courses taken at other UC campuses and through the Education Abroad Program.

# **Grade Point Average**

The grade point average is determined by dividing the number of grade points earned by the number of credits attempted for a letter grade. The number of grade points earned for a course equals the number of grade points assigned multiplied by the number of course credits. For example, suppose a student takes three 5-credit courses and receives grades of A-, B-, and C+.

# 43.5 divided by 15 = 2.9 GPA

Grade points are assigned to each letter grade as shown below. Grades shown in bold (W, I, IP, P, NP) are not included in the UCSC GPA.

For students entering UCSC since fall 1997, both the UC and the UCSC GPA are available on TELESLUG when listing grades from a previous quarter. For students who entered UCSC prior to fall 1997, the UC GPA is available when listing grades from a previous quarter.

# **Graduate Students**

# Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory Grading and the Letter Grade Option

Beginning fall 1997, all graduate students in graduate or undergraduate courses will be graded Satisfactory (S) (equivalent to a B or better), Unsatisfactory (U), or Incomplete (I). Graduate students also have the option of receiving a letter grade of A, B, C, D, or F in most courses. The grades of A or B shall be awarded for satisfactory work. Grades of C or D will not satisfy any course requirement for a graduate degree at UCSC.

In order to receive a letter grade, you must enter your letter grade request using TELESLUG (or in person at the Office of the Registrar) no later than the 15th day of instruction for **each class** in **each quarter.** 

# **Evaluations**

Graduate students receive an evaluation for each credit course in which they enroll.

# **Incompletes**

An Incomplete grade notation may be assigned when the graduate student's work is of passing quality but is incomplete. See the *Graduate Student Handbook* for complete instructions about arrangements to receive and to remove an Incomplete grade notation.

# **In Progress**

The notation IP (In Progress) is restricted to certain sequential courses that extend over two or three quarters of an academic year. The grade option you select in the first quarter of the multiple term sequence applies to all quarters of the sequence. You receive the same notation for each course upon completion of the two- or three-quarter sequence, and the final grade is applied to all quarters.

# **Repeating Courses**

Graduate students may repeat a course in which they earn a grade of C, D, F, or U. Degree credit for a repeated course will be granted only once, and the most recently earned grade will be used to determine whether a degree requirement has been met.

# **Either way**

- Graduate students enrolled in physical education courses will be graded Pass/No Record.
- Graduate students enrolling in undergraduate courses will be graded as outlined above.

This section includes an alphabetical listing of information important to all students. Detailed descriptions of academic policies and procedures are found in *The Navigator* and the *Graduate Student Handbook*. These detailed handbooks are available at the college office for undergraduates and the department office for graduate students.

# **Academic Integrity**

All members of the UCSC academic community have an explicit responsibility to present as their original work only that which is truly their own. Cheating, plagiarism, and other forms of academic dishonesty are contrary to the ideals and purposes of a university and will not be tolerated. Note that plagiarism includes the deliberate misrepresentation of someone else's words and ideas as your own, as well as paraphrasing without footnoting the source. Students and faculty are jointly responsible for assuring that the integrity of scholarship is valued and preserved.

#### **Due Process**

Students charged with academic dishonesty have the right to due process through established policies and regulations concerning student conduct and discipline. Copies of these policies and regulations can be found in the UCSC Student Policies and Regulations Handbook (www2.ucsc.edu/judicial/).

# **Academic Standing (Undergraduates)**

To measure academic standing, the Academic Senate has set a minimum number of credits in which a student must receive a grade of P, A, B, or C each quarter to remain eligible to continue enrollment. Most students maintain good academic standing, but it is important to understand the minimum progress standard in case difficulty occurs. There are two criteria for determining minimum progress: cumulative progress and current progress. You must meet both criteria each quarter to satisfy minimum progress. It is a good idea to discuss any academic problems you may have with an academic preceptor at your college. Informing one of them of anticipated difficulties, special needs, and unusual circumstances that might affect your academic work is the best way to avert academic censure. See also Evaluating Undergraduate Academic Performance, page 28, for changes in grading and academic standing policies.

# **Address Changes**

It is important for UCSC offices to have access to accurate address information for all UCSC students. UCSC relies on the addresses on the UCSC Student Portal to send you official information. You must update your address each time you change your residence, or you will miss important documents and deadlines. Read through the definitions below to

understand the different types of addresses maintained by UCSC before making changes.

College address (fall, winter, spring quarters): This address is assigned by your college. The Financial Aid Office uses this address as a secondary address for mailings to students who do not have a local address or whose mail is returned.

Please remember you must separately register a forwarding address with your college for your United States Postal Service (USPS) mail to be forwarded. Colleges can forward USPS mail for a period of one year in case of graduation or leave of absence.

**Local (year round):** This should always be your current address. It is your responsibility to keep this address up-to-date and prevent important campus mail from being misdirected.

- Billing statements are mailed to the local address unless you establish a third-party billing address. Other mailings to this address may include credit balance refunds and general mailings from campus units. The Financial Aid Office uses this address as the primary address for all mailings.
- During fall, winter, and spring quarters, you may use a college address as your local address. **Summer:** After spring quarter ends and before fall quarter begins, a college address is not a valid local address. For this reason, it is important to keep your local address updated during the summer, so you do not miss important communications and deadlines. Students in residence for the summer should check at their place of residence (college, the Village, the UCSC Inn, or University Town Center [UTC]) for specific summer mail policies.

Please remember you must separately register a forwarding address with your college for your USPS mail to be forwarded. Colleges can forward USPS mail for a period of one year in the case of graduation or a leave of absence.

**Permanent (year round):** This address may be the same as your local address or the address of a relative, but it may not be your college address. Your diploma will be sent to this address. The Financial Aid Office uses this address during the summer; and, if mail is returned, and they have been unable to contact you using other addresses.

**Billing (year round):** If you would like your Statement of Account mailed to a third party, such as your parents, grandparents, or guardian, you must establish a billing address. Billing addresses are used only for statements going to someone other than you.

A Release of Information (ROI) allows the Student Business Services office to discuss your Statement of Account with whomever you authorize. No specific information regarding financial activity will be released to or discussed with a third party, including parents, without the consent of the student. The ROI applies only to the Statement of Account and does not release you from financial responsibility.

# **Administrative Cancellation**

Your student status may be cancelled by the campus administration at any time for the reasons listed below. If you

- are barred from enrollment for one or more quarters for academic deficiencies;
- are disqualified for academic deficiencies;
- receive disciplinary action;
- fail to respond to official university notices;
- · fail to settle financial obligations; or
- fail to enroll in classes.

Cancellation for any of the first three reasons will be noted on your official academic record.

Administrative cancellation means that your enrollments are dropped, financial aid is cancelled, and you are ineligible to use campus services reserved for students. The registration fee refund, if applicable, is determined by the effective date of the administrative cancellation.

# **Advance Course Information**

Advance Course Information (ACI) is designed to complement advance enrollment. It supplies more course information online than is available through the UCSC General Catalog.

Also available via ACI are book lists for the current quarter. These are arranged by department and are provided by the Bay Tree Bookstore. To get to the ACI web page directly, go to reg.ucsc.edu/soc/aci.

Faculty participation in ACI is voluntary; therefore, information is not available for all classes. If you have any questions, comments, or ideas, you can e-mail ACI at aci@ucsc.edu.

# **Advising**

Advisers are available in the colleges to assist undergraduates with general planning issues, such as choosing appropriate course loads, maintaining good academic progress, and integrating majors and minors in an overall academic plan. Advising for specific major and minor programs is offered at the departments. Students may also consult with faculty, career counselors, educational opportunity advisers, psychological counselors, and disability resource specialists, among others.

# **Announcing Candidacy to Graduate**

To be a candidate for the bachelor's degree, you must file an Announcement of Candidacy at the Office of the Registrar by the posted quarterly deadline.

If you announce your candidacy for a degree but do not complete the requirements for graduation, you will not automatically be considered a continuing student for the subsequent quarter. Go to the Office of the Registrar to cancel or reschedule your announcement of candidacy and to receive enrollment and fee payment instructions.

# **Auditing of Classes**

You may audit (sit in on) a regular course with the permission of the instructor in charge. The instructor may allow you to attend course meetings but only if adequate facilities are available after all students who wish to enroll officially have done so. The instructor is not obligated to devote time to your work. Auditors ordinarily do not write papers or take exams. Since you are not enrolled in the class, there is no record kept; and you receive no grade notation, evaluation, or credit. You are not eligible to audit classes if you've been barred or disqualified for academic or disciplinary reasons, have withdrawn, or are on leave of absence.

# **Cancelled Courses**

Occasionally, it is necessary for a sponsoring agency to cancel a course after students have advance enrolled. Whenever possible, the course-sponsoring agency will notify enrolled students about the cancellation. Check the *Schedule of Classes* (*reg.ucsc.edu/soc*) on the web for updates. Go online to the Student Portal to check your enrollments for cancellations or changes in meeting times, days, or location.

# Certification of Student Status for Outside Agencies

The Office of the Registrar is the only agency on campus authorized to certify student status and academic standing for outside agencies such as student loan institutions, insurance companies, child care programs, banks, and employers. You may request enrollment certification in person or by mail.

If you need a certification of student status to defer a federally insured student loan, your request will be forwarded to the National Student Loan Clearinghouse for processing. Most lenders contact this agency directly for confirmation of student status.

If you are registered and enrolled, a certification for the current academic year will be produced as you wait at 190 Hahn from 9 A.M. to noon. Valid photo identification is required. Certifications requested after noon will be ready for pickup after 1 P.M. the following day.

# **Computing Facilities and Services**

UC Santa Cruz is rapidly expanding its computing environment. We want you to be aware of computing facilities and services so that you can take full advantage of the campus computing resources. Here are the key points:

 Students are expected to communicate via email using a UCSC e-mail account. Your account is assigned when you enroll for classes the first time. There is no cost for the e-mail account. Mail may be accessed via the web on CruzMail.

- The campus is rapidly expanding its CruzNet
  wireless network to reach many points on the
  campus by early 2004. This means that if you
  have a laptop computer with a wireless network card, you'll be able to sit down with a
  group of classmates in a serene setting among
  the redwoods or at a cafe with an ocean view
  to do your homework and still have Internet
  access.
- Because of the ubiquitous wireless access being developed, we highly recommend that you purchase a laptop computer. We have included minimum specifications below.
- The campus offers a high-speed data residential network called ResNet to all students living in university residential areas. The service cost is included in the housing fees. There are no additional fees for students who live in university residential areas to use the service which includes technical support (by phone or office visits when necessary) provided by ResNet staff.
- There are 15 instructional computing labs across the campus with high-speed network service and specialized hardware and software. Each lab is open to all students.

# Purchasing a Computer?

If you are planning on buying a new computer and using it for at least four years while on campus, UCSC recommends purchasing a **laptop with both wired** and wireless network capability. In 2003–04, 98 percent of students who came to campus had a personally owned computer in his/her residential housing room.

An excellent source for purchasing computers and computer products is the university's Bay Tree Bookstore, right on campus (*slugstore.ucsc.edu*); phone (831) 459-2082. Through university negotiated contracts, the bookstore offers a full line of Apple and Dell computers as well as software and peripheral equipment. Because of your student status, pricing is almost always below outside market prices. And, the bookstore works closely with campus computing specialists to be certain the equipment you buy will meet campus specifications, both wired and wireless. As an added convenience, Apple products can be ordered in advance through the bookstore and be ready for pickup when you arrive on campus.

Technology vendors frequently use the "Back-to-School" time frame for additional special pricing, so you might want to check with the Bay Tree Bookstore in July and August as you begin thinking about shopping for a computer. The Bay Tree Bookstore staff can help you make the right choices for your campus computing needs.

The campus community embraces both PCs and Macs, and, in some circles, Unix-based Sun Solaris and Linux are popular. The Divisions of Humanities and Arts are both heavily Mac-oriented. The Divi-

sions of Social Sciences and Physical and Biological Sciences use both Macs and PCs. The School of Engineering is primarily PC/Windows and PC/Linux (as well as Sun Solaris), and there is an emerging interest in Macintosh with the Unix-based OS X environment.

If you are purchasing PC, we recommend that you purchase a Pentium 4 with a minimum 800MHz or equivalent microprocessor, 256MB or more of RAM (512K is best), and a minimum 20GB hard drive. In general, if you are purchasing a PC (and are not interested repairing a computer yourself), we recommend that you purchase a computer manufactured by a major vendor such as Dell that is highly rated for reliability and service. For software on a PC, we recommend Microsoft Office that includes Microsoft Word. Most faculty are accustomed to receiving student papers in Microsoft Word files.

If you are purchasing a Macintosh, a 400+MHz PowerMac G4 or an iMac, also with 256MB or more of RAM and a 20GB hard drive, is recommended running Mac OS 9 or better. UCSC recommends Microsoft Windows XP and Apple OS X for new machines. For more recommendations on computer hardware and software, please visit the ResNet web site at resnet.ucsc.edu.

# UCSC Computer Accounts and CruzMail

Students are expected to communicate via e-mail using a UCSC **e-mail account**. E-mail is a useful tool for communicating with faculty, teaching assistants, and other students. In many cases, e-mail is the most timely method of communication on campus.

To use the computing and networking resources at UCSC, you must first activate your UCSC computer account that was assigned when you enrolled for your first quarter at UCSC. You can activate your account by following the instructions at www2.ucsc.edu/cats/sc/help/intro/accounts.shtml, or receive assistance in any staffed instructional computing lab. See ic.ucsc. edu/labs/. If you have any questions about your account, visit the Communications and Technology Services (CATS) Information Resource Center, 50 Communications Building; call (831) 459-4357 (459-HELP); or e-mail help@ucsc.edu.

All students should activate a UCSC e-mail account even if they use another e-mail address. A UCSC account is an online ID that gives access to secure online resources. Faculty expect students to have a UCSC account to receive class information.

CruzMail is web mail service for UCSC accounts. Students can access their UCSC e-mail by opening a web browser and going to *cruzmail.ucsc.edu/*. E-mail may be stored and managed on the CruzMail server.

Campus academic divisions also may provide computing facilities and services to serve their specific disciplines. There may be additional rules or policies associated with these discipline-specific services and facilities.

Because the Internet is a dynamic environment, you should be aware of the following:

- Students using UC Santa Cruz computing facilities and services must comply with the University of California state and federal policies and laws referenced at <a href="https://www2.ucsc.edu/cats/sc/help/policies/">www2.ucsc.edu/cats/sc/help/policies/</a>. While this policies web page lists many of the university policies, it in no way is meant as an exhaustive and complete list. New regulations, policies, and procedures are constantly evolving. Also, laws, policies, or other regulations on aspects not specific to networks or computing may apply, e.g., student conduct, personnel policy or contract, sexual harassment, chain letter laws, or other regulations.
- Web pages at UCSC (and beyond) are expanding and changing rapidly. Please send questions regarding any information found on the web to the web page author listed at the bottom of each web page.

# Network and Phones for Students Living on Campus

Student Communication Services (SCS) is a partner-ship between Housing, Dining, and Child Care Services and Communications and Technology Services that provides in-room Internet access (called ResNet) and a university-owned and operated telephone system. Network services are available to undergraduate and graduate students living in university housing (except for the Camper Park). For assistance with network connections, students can contact ResNet at resnet@ucsc.edu or (831) 459-4638. Please check the web site at resnet.ucsc.edu for more information.

Local telephone service is provided in every student room (except for the Camper Park and Family Student Housing). Students must use calling cards to place long distance calls. Call (831) 459-3865, or e-mail scs@ucsc.edu for more information on phone services.

# Modem Access for Students off Campus

If you want to connect your computer from off campus, you can connect via a university modem pool at no charge, but with limited connection hours per week. See <a href="https://www2.ucsc.edu/cats/sc/services/remote.access.shtml">www2.ucsc.edu/cats/sc/services/remote.access.shtml</a> for more information on this topic and information on configuring your computer software for these options.

## Security Software to Prevent Viruses and Worms

Student-owned computers coming to campus may be vulnerable or already infected with worms like Blaster and Welchia viruses, and worms target Windows more than other operating systems. A computer that is infected with a virus or worm can infect many others when it is connected to the network. Note that if you use the campus modem pool, you are connecting to the campus network.

The UCSC Security Team and ResNet have tools in place to identify vulnerable and infected computers. If you live on campus, contact ResNet for assistance; and if you live off campus, go to *its.ucsc.edu* for assistance. **Vulnerable or infected computers will be disconnected from the network.** 

# Computing Labs for Drop-in Use and Academic Classes

Instructional Computing (IC) manages 15 computer labs throughout the campus. These include the Digital Media Lab in the Arts and the Solaris Unix labs for students in the sciences and engineering. There is a wireless laptop lab at the Academic Resources Center where you can check out an Apple laptop and have a network connection while sitting in the meadow overlooking the ocean (see *ic.ucsc.edu/labs/lab descriptions/arc/*). The 15 labs have over 340 computers available for students to use including PCs, Macs, and Sun workstations.

The computing labs are used like classrooms and may be reserved by faculty or teaching assistants for instruction. When not reserved for instruction, the labs are available to students on a walk-in basis. Even if they are not teaching in the labs, many faculty request to have academic software installed in the labs so that their students can complete homework assignments. Every IC lab is open to every student, no matter what his or her major.

Technical training is available for students in the computer labs. In addition, faculty or teaching assistants can request that CATS/IC staff conduct training sessions as part of an academic course. More extensive lab information, including hardware and software specifications and hours of operation, is available at *ic.ucsc.edu*.

#### Academic Course Materials on the Web

The WebCT course management system is a tool to create sophisticated web-based course materials to supplement classroom instruction, not to replace it. WebCT uses a web browser as the interface for the course. Faculty using WebCT can incorporate a wide variety of tools in their course site such as a course calendar, student conferencing system, electronic mail, group projects with student-created web pages, and quizzes. Outside of class time, students can use WebCT to view course materials, participate in web-based class discussions, collaborate on student group projects, and take quizzes. Faculty can use WebCT to

see what materials students have viewed before they arrive in class. When faculty administer pre-class quizzes on WebCT, they can see what concepts students understand before class and tailor the lecture accordingly. Students must have established their UCSC account to be enrolled in WebCT courses. See more information about WebCT and other UCSC course web sites at ic.ucsc.edu/docs/webct and ic.ucsc.edu/

# **Need Disability Accommodations for Computing?**

Instructional computing labs have common adaptive technologies, such as enlarged type for students with low vision and Dvorak keyboards for students with repetitive strain injuries. # **Computing Use Policies**

# **Cross-Enrollment**

The cross-enrollment program permits UCSC students who meet certain eligibility criteria to enroll in one undergraduate course, on a space-available basis each quarter or semester, at a California community college or California state university. The host campus may charge a \$10 administrative fee each quarter, and students must reapply each quarter they wish to cross-enroll at another campus.

*Note:* not all community colleges participate in the cross-enrollment program; contact the institution where you wish to enroll in for information.

# **Lost and Found**

The first place to go for lost and found items is the nearest college or department office. Items that are not claimed from these offices are taken to the University Police Office, located in the H Barn near the main entrance to the campus, 459-2231.

# **Name Change**

Name Change petitions are available at the Office of the Registrar. A student who is currently enrolled or announcing candidacy and is requesting an official name change on their academic records must complete this form and present it, in person, at the Office of the Registrar. You must submit documentation showing legal change of name (court order) or use of requested name on official documentation (e.g., drivers license, social security card, passport, marriage certificate, etc.). You may also correct your name at the Office of the Registrar if, for example, it is misspelled or the punctuation is incorrect. Be prepared to show proof of the correctly spelled name.

When you file a Name Change petition, you may also order and pay for a new student ID card at the Bay Tree Bookstore Building.

# **Nonrelease of Public Information**

The following information is considered public information and may be disclosed: name, college or local address, e-mail address, local telephone number, college and major field of study, dates of attendance, class level, enrollment status, intercollegiate athlete's height and weight, and degrees and honors received.

To have this information withheld from release, file a Request for Nonrelease of Public Information at the Office of the Registrar by the date specified in the calendar at the front of this schedule. Be sure that you understand the implications of filing this request. Every single item listed above will be withheld.

Once a Request for Nonrelease of Public Information is filed, it remains in effect—even after you are no longer attending UCSC—until you request to rescind it in writing.

# **Student Identification Card**

A plastic card bearing your picture is issued the first quarter of enrollment, generally during college orientation.

Each quarter the college (department for graduate students) issues a validation sticker to be affixed to your ID card. The sticker is issued once you have completed registration and is available beginning the first day of the quarter. The card with the current quarter sticker is proof that you are registered. The college or department will not issue a sticker if your quarterly fees are unpaid. Go to the Office of the Registrar to complete your registration, and a sticker will be provided.

# **Student Identification Number (SID)**

UCSC utilizes the Social Security number as the student number. If you would prefer to use an assigned number rather than the Social Security number, file a request at the Office of the Registrar, free of charge.

# **Transcript Information**

A transcript is an official copy of a student's academic history at UCSC and is embossed with the registrar's seal and the signature of the university registrar. Official transcripts are mailed in sealed university envelopes. A transcript includes undergraduate, graduate and/or summer session courses, degrees awarded, degree honors, grades and notations, and transfer credit.

Transcripts are available for \$5 without evaluations and \$10 with evaluations. A transcript with evaluations includes evaluations of courses passed in chronological order and an evaluation of the comprehensive examination or senior thesis.

Transcripts are processed on a first-in, first-out basis. Transcripts must be requested well in advance to meet deadlines. Allow 10 business days for processing from the date we receive your request. During busy periods (November through February), processing time may take longer.

You may request and pay an additional fee for your transcript to be mailed via next-day service. This service provides fast delivery and a receipt that the transcript was received by the recipient. This service expedites transit time, not processing time. Federal Express is used for all destinations, and they will not deliver to post office box addresses or on weekends. The additional charge for Federal Express within the U.S. is \$15 for up to three transcripts going to the same address. The additional charge for Federal Express outside the U.S. is \$20 per transcript (with or without evaluations). Please note that if the appropriate fee has not been received for next-day service, your transcript will be sent via regular mail.

Instructions and Transcript Request Forms are available at the Office of the Registrar or via the web at *reg.ucsc.edu*. For recorded instructions, please call (831) 459-4412.

Transcript requests will not be processed if you have outstanding obligations to the university. Contact the Office of Student Business Services, (831) 459-2136 or (831) 459-2940, for questions regarding a university hold on your records. In this instance, the request form will be returned to the student.

For a \$5 fee, you may request a Certificate of Completion of Degree, which includes your name, the date your degree will be awarded/was awarded, major, college, and honors, if any. A certificate can be prepared if you have announced candidacy for the quarter, and all requirements have been completed as verified by the Office of the Registrar and your department. Its use is limited to providing verification of a pending/awarded degree. Universities usually require a complete official transcript.

# **Veterans and Veterans' Dependents**

Veteran Services staff, located at 190 Hahn Student Services Building, serves as a liaison between students and the Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA), certifying enrollment and academic progress for veterans, veterans' dependents, and reservists. The staff also assists with the Cal Vet program, which offers fee waivers to dependents of veterans who died or are disabled due to a service disability.

As a veteran or veteran's dependent, you should contact Veteran Services as soon as you receive notification of admission here to ensure timely processing of your benefits claims.

Veterans and veterans' dependents who are eligible for educational benefits from the DVA are expected to make satisfactory progress towards completion of the degree objective. If you remain on academic probation beyond two quarters without improvement, your benefits will be subject to suspension. Your academic standing may be affected if you attempt less than 15 credits each quarter. Dropping a course or requesting a W grade may affect the amount of your payments and must be reported immediately to Veteran Services. Please note that you cannot be paid for auditing a course. # Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997

The Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997 includes a number of educational tax benefits that may have an impact on students and their families. The act includes the following sections that involve the university reporting information on students to the Internal Revenue Service.

- Hope Scholarship Tax Credit (effective 1/98): a nonrefundable credit equal to a maximum of \$1500 in out-of-pocket qualified tuition and fee expenses paid by or on behalf of a student for two tax years during which the student is enrolled at least half time in the first or second year of post-secondary education leading to a recognized degree or certificate.
- Lifetime Learning Credit (effective 7/98):

   a nonrefundable credit equal to 20 percent of the \$5,000 of qualified out-of-pocket tuition and fee expenses paid by or on behalf of a student enrolled in post-secondary course work at the undergraduate or graduate level leading to a recognized degree or certificate or to improved job skills.
- Student Loan Interest Deduction (effective 1/98): a deduction from income of up to \$1000 in qualified education loan interest due and paid during the first 60 months of repayment.

# **Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act**

# Federal Student Right-to-Know Act

The following graduation-rate information is listed in compliance with the 1990 Title I: Federal Right-to-Know Act, Section 103. Based on recent data, 41 percent of students who entered UCSC as freshpersons in 1991 graduated after four years, and 61 percent of those who entered in 1990 graduated after five years. In recent years, students who entered as freshpersons took an average of four and one-half years to graduate, and students transferring to UCSC as juniors averaged two and one-half years. These graduation rates are well above the national averages.

# **Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act**

# Physical Education Classes Important Information!

Instead, come to the first day of class. There is a strong possibility that you will be able to enroll at that point.

# Overview of General Education Requirements

Designed to expose students to diverse subject areas, the general education requirements also stress a variety of approaches to acquiring knowledge.

Most current students follow the general education requirements at UCSC that fall into nine areas and are described below. Each area has a general education code associated with it, and only those courses carrying that code satisfy the requirement. The codes appear in the course descriptions in the *UCSC General Catalog* and in the "GEN ED" column of the course listings in each *Schedule of Classes*. Some courses satisfy more than one requirement, so the total number of required courses may be as few as nine or as many as 14. Courses with values of 1, 2, or 3 credits, such as some music courses, may be combined to satisfy general education requirements if they have the appropriate codes and total at least 5 credits.

It is often advised that students who have not decided on a major should complete all six disciplinary introductions (IH, IN, IS codes), at least one of the topical courses (T code), the quantitative methods course (Q code), and the composition course (C code) during the first three quarters of enrollment. However, students pursuing certain science majors must also fit in appropriate prerequisite sequences for upper-division science requirements. The writing-intensive course (W code), arts course (A code), and U.S. ethnic minorities/non-western society course (E code) can be satisfied with many upper- as well as lower-division courses.

If you have consulted with your academic adviser and feel you have an unusually strong case for an exception to a general education requirement, you may file a Petition for Substitution or Waiver at your college. Do not wait until the quarter you expect to graduate; these petitions are reviewed by many people before they can be approved. These petitions are carefully screened by the Committee on Educational Policy (CEP); specific and rigorous criteria are used. If the petition is approved, your academic record will be changed to reflect the exception. If you have taken a course through an exchange program (ICV, UNH, UNM, EAP, or UCDC), and you think it will satisfy a general education requirement, you may initiate review of the course by completing a Review of Transfer Credit form at the Admissions Office, with the exception of writing or topical requirements; these must be reviewed by CEP.

Enrolling in general education courses: the section of the class you enroll in will satisfy a general education requirement only if the appropriate general education code(s) appears in the GEN ED column of the *Schedule of Classes*. Different sections of the same course may have different codes. Transfer and advanced placement credits may satisfy some or all of the general education requirements. The Admissions Office will provide you with a Transfer Credit Summary (TCS) Evaluation which lists the general education requirements that you have satisfied.

# **Brief Descriptions of General Education Codes**

General education requirements were devised and are reviewed by the Santa Cruz Division of the Academic Senate through the Committee on Educational Policy. There are nine categories of general education requirements. Specific information regarding how general education requirements fit into bachelor's degree requirements can be found in the *UCSC General Catalog* and the *Navigator*. The descriptive codes for these requirements are explained below.

Introductions to Disciplines: These courses inform students of a discipline's scope or methodology, prepare students effectively for advanced classes, or both. Students are advised about a discipline's suitability as a major or are prepared for advanced course work in the field. Most of these courses are required of majors. They do not require prerequisites. The three categories are Introduction to Humanities and Arts (IH code), Introduction to Natural Sciences (IN code), and Introduction to Social Sciences (IS code).

Topical requirements (T code): The topical requirement is intended to show students how disciplines outside their own affect public life, how different disciplines approach a common topic, and the richness in the areas of study that lie outside or between academic disciplines. Topical courses address a topic of broad intellectual or social relevance—instead of a discipline—and study it from a broad, interdisciplinary perspective. They can provide a place for discussion of values and assumptions at an introductory level not usually found in introductory courses. They are not designed to introduce the discipline to non-majors.

Quantitative requirement (Q code): This requirement involves acquisition of technical skill in mathematics or practice in the ability to apply that mathematical skill in specific contexts or both. A quantitative course must involve the use of advanced algebra, statistics, or calculus. These courses provide instruction in quantitative reasoning rather than merely evaluating students' mathematical ability. Courses in logic or computers are not considered mathematical.

Composition requirement (C code): This requirement is usually fulfilled by Writing 1, *Composition and Rhetoric*, which stresses essay development. Some sections of the Stevenson Core Course also fulfill the C requirement; see page 38 for a complete list of composition courses. Students must complete the University Subject A requirement before enrolling in a course which satisfies the composition requirement.

Writing-intensive requirement (W code): These courses often require more writing than other classes, but they also stress explicit attention to the craft of writing in the subject matter of the course or discipline. Papers are assigned throughout the quarter, and editorial comment is provided by the instructor. Students must complete the University Subject A requirement and satisfy the Composition requirement before enrolling in a course which satisfies the writing-intensive requirement.

Arts requirement (A code): This requirement was established in recognition of the differences between the humanities and the arts and of the necessity for both in liberal arts education. One 5-credit course, or the equivalent, is required in the performance, theory, or history of the arts.

U.S. Ethnic Minorities/Non-Western Society requirement (E code): This requirement is intended to increase student and faculty knowledge of non-Western cultures (in the U.S. and elsewhere); to improve cross-cultural awareness, skills, and sensitivity; and to explore relationships between ethnicity and other topics of liberal arts curriculum.

# Topical Courses (T code)—Three courses required (15 credits)

# **Spring 2004 Course Descriptions**

The following course descriptions are for new courses offered spring quarter 2004. Descriptions for individual studies courses are not included in these listings. Please contact the course sponsoring agencies for additional information.

#### College Eight

## 42A. Student-Directed Seminar: Ecopsychology and Social Change.

An interdisciplinary course combining the fields of ecology, psychology, sociological theory, and environmental theory. Examines the reciprocal relationship between humanity and the Earth and methods of creating social change through uniting social justice movements with environmental movements. Enrollment limited to 20.

#### College Nine

### 88B. Peer Influences on School Performance (2 credits).

Focuses on the complex ways in which peer relations influence schooling outcomes during the high school years. Gives attention to the interactive role of race, class, gender, and school structures in shaping school performance patterns. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### College Ten

#### 88A. Communicating Gender (2 credits).

Examines how gender is defined and maintained through verbal and nonverbal communication in the family, peer group, schools, and the media. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### Cowell College

#### 85. Introduction to Chinese Writing Systems.

Gateway course illuminating the operation of the writing systems of Greater China. Intended for students who are curious about the world's longest continually used symbol set as well as for those who may be considering a serious commitment to learning the language.

#### Merrill College

#### 88A. Ethical Problems (2 credits).

Focuses on two intensely controversial moral issues: abortion and affirmative action. Students will discuss articles on different sides of these issues and write brief responses as well as a five-page paper on a moral problem of the student's choice. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### Porter College

#### 21C. Gospel Choir (2 credits).

Instruction in vocal performance in the tradition of gospel choirs. Music is transmitted aurally rather than by notation. The ensemble prepares a range of traditional and contemporary gospel music for performance. Ensemble performs publicly at least once each quarter. Prerequisite(s): admission by permission of director. Enrollment limited to 50. May be repeated for credit. (General Education Code: A.)

#### 32A. Queering the Arts (2 credits).

Exploration of the arts as a way to understand and experience how queerness has been expressed, repressed, denigrated, and celebrated in visual arts, music, film, poetry, and dance. Enrollment limited to 30. (General Education Code: A.)

#### American Studies

#### 190D. New Directions in American Studies.

Examines the history and state of the field of American studies. Investigates current debates in the field, with a focus on recent calls for a "post-nationalist" American studies, and begins to chart some of the directions in which the field is moving. Encourages students to reflect on their education in American studies at UCSC. Enrollment limited to 20. Enrollment restricted to senior American studies majors.

## 222. Tradition and Modernity in Black Culture.

Examines the interplay of past and present in expressive culture by, for, and about African Americans, especially in respect to artistic and social innovations and their relationships to history, collective memory, and tradition. Upper-division students may enroll via permission code from instructor. Enrollment limited to 15. Enrollment restricted to graduate students.

#### 223. Cultural Citizenship.

Seminar examines the right to be different and belong in a participatory, democratic sense. Explores vernacular definitions of what confers political and cultural entitlement, taking into consideration factors ranging from the economic to notions of dignity and respect. Enrollment limited to 10. Enrollment restricted to graduate students.

#### Anthropology

#### 88C. Chicana Traditions (2 credits).

Designed exclusively for students who are new to our campus. Students work in an intimate seminar setting to learn about my research and scholarly activities, Mexican women's popular culture and folklore. Class meets once a week for two hours. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### 174. Origins of Complex Societies.

Deals with evidence and theories concerning the origins of complex society; the transition from egalitarian, foraging societies to the hierarchical, economically specialized societies often referred to as "civilizations." Focuses on both Old World and New World cultures. Prerequisite(s): course 3.

### 194G. Ritual Performance: The Riddle of "Spirit Possession".

Examines competing ethnographic interpretations of ritual "spirit possession" practices. Addresses the pathologizing

and theatricalizing of "spirit possession," the emic/etic debate, and questions of embodiment and agency that are pivotal to the postmodern and postcolonial reassessment of anthropology. Prerequisite(s): satisfaction of the Subject A and Composition requirements. Enrollment limited to 20. Enrollment restricted to senior anthropology majors. (General Education Code: W.)

#### 242. Writing Ethnography.

Seminar examines ethnography as a genre of writing and as a "workshop of cultural production." Looks at changes in the anthropological genre of ethnography over the last 100 years and compares the anthropological genre with related genres. Enrollment limited to 15. Enrollment restricted to graduate students.

#### Art

#### 88B. Everyday Performance (2 credits).

Teaches a process for creatively transforming ordinary experience into visual performance art. Students engage in class exercises, creative writing, and group collaboration to demystify this art form. Class curates a final performance art event. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### **Biology**

#### 88A. Exercise Physiology As If Your Life Depended on It (2 credits).

Study and discuss theory and practice of exercise physiology using selections from a popular textbook, individual research projects, and observations/analysis of an ongoing research project in exercise physiology in the Office of Physical Education, Recreation, and Sports (OPERS). Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

### 88B. Diseases and Health Disparities (1 credit).

Describes major diseases (breast cancer, cardiovascular, diabetes, and so on) relative to their pathologies and treatments. Addresses biological factors causing/contributing to health disparities with emphasis on diabetes and cancer. Also addresses the incidence, prevalence, and biological causes of health disparities in the U.S. and its territories. Emphasizes biological determinants of health disparities associated with major diseases on the populations which have a preponderance of these diseases, especially minority and underserved populations. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### **Community Studies**

# 42D. Student-Directed Seminar: Using Nonviolence in the Twentieth Century.

Teaches the theory and practice of nonviolence in the personal and political realm. Students examine conflicts—past and present—to come up with new peace-

ful and promising ways to handle the future. Enrollment limited to 20.

## 42U. Student-Directed Seminar: The Spoken Word: Roots of Change.

Examines the political and social power of the individual voice's root to social movements. Combines writing workshops and analysis of oral tradition with a study of spoken political media. Aims to be the example community that the spoken word can build. Enrollment limited to 20.

#### 42V. Student-Directed Seminar: (Agri) Cultural Challenges: Bridging the Gap.

Examines the role urban communities play in promoting a culturally rich and sustainable agriculture, both locally through community-supported agriculture and nationally by raising concerns about the loss of small farms, soil erosion, GMO technology, the use of resources, and our dependence on nonrenewable energy. Enrollment limited to 20.

# 42W. Student-Directed Seminar: Appropriate Technologies and Local Self-Reliance.

What is this rat race of science, technology, progress, and labor? Ten workshops to question the theory and practice of "sustainability" and energy systems with the intention of organizing around applicable alternatives. Topics include ecological design, holistic health, waste, contradictions, anarchism, solar, biofuels, local policy, sociology, ethics, and humanistic economics. Syllabus available online. Enrollment limited to 20.

#### 42X. Student-Directed Seminar: Unions, Co-ops, and Social Movements: Toward a Democratic Economy.

Introduces students to theories and practices of democratizing the economy, looking at labor unions and cooperatives as case studies. Examines union and coop activism from the perspectives of social movement theories, privilege and positionality, transnationality, and politicization. Enrollment limited to 20.

# 42Z. Student-Directed Seminar: Illicit Drug Use and HIV Prevention.

Sociopolitical examination of American drug policy and the ways in which our current policy affects the lives of drug users based on differences in race, class, and gender, with a specific focus on how drug policy impedes HIV prevention efforts. Enrollment limited to 20.

#### 115. Queer Arts and Activism.

Historical exploration of both activist and artistic lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) communities in the twentieth century. Some cultures, including 1950's butch-femme, inspired artistic representations and liberations movements. Other communities, such as ACT UP, intentionally synthesized art and activism. Focuses on literary and film arts and on local activism. Enrollment limited to 25.

#### 138. Immigrant Women in Film.

Analyzes the relationship between content and production processes in the documentation of immigrant women's lives in the U.S. from the perspective of the social documentarian.

## 185. Professions Training Program: Internship Preparation (2 credits).

For all students preparing for an internship. Explora-

tion of career objectives, tools and resources to assist in finding and securing the ideal internship, and techniques for maximizing the benefits of the internship experience. Internships are the ticket to career choices.

#### **Computer Engineering**

### 88C. Multimedia, the Web, and All That (1 credit).

A light introduction to multimedia data and applications, with an emphasis on networked systems and the Internet. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### **Computer Science**

#### 181. Database Systems II.

Introduction to the architecture and implementation of database systems. Topics covered include data storage, tree and hash indexes, storage management, query evaluation and optimization, transaction management, concurrency control, recovery, and XML data management. Prerequisite(s): course 180. Enrollment limited to 50.

#### 290H. Topics in Database Systems.

Focuses on current research topics in database systems. Different offerings cover different topics depending on current research of instructor(s) and the interests of students. Students read technical papers from journal and conference proceedings and present class lectures. A research project is required. Prerequisite(s): course 180 (or equivalent) or 277 or consent of instructor. Enrollment limited to 20. Enrollment restricted to graduate students.

#### **Economics**

## 88C. Morals and Markets in Evolutionary Perspective (1 credit).

Covers recent ideas on the emergence of human moral systems in Paleolithic times and the more recent emergence of large-scale market exchange. Considers major issues in the modern world as arising from the "troubled marriage of morals and markets." Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### **Electrical Engineering**

# 88A. Nanobiotechnology: The Exploration and Diagnostics of Inner Space (1 credit). The miniaturization of electronic devices has fueled

The miniaturization of electronic devices has fueled the information revolution. Seminar explores how this miniaturization technology can be extended and used for creating micro and nanodevices with applications in the biological and biomedical sciences. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### **Environmental Studies**

#### 42C. Student-Directed Seminar: Ecopsychology.

Explores cultural separation between self, community members, and the environment. Examines methods of restoring broken connections to promote personal, environmental, and social healing from urban garden projects to wilderness immersion. Includes one required weekend camping trip. Enrollment limited to 20.

#### **Environmental Toxicology**

## 88A. Environmental Toxicology: Real World Applications (1 credit).

Designed to provide perspectives on the applications of basic and applied research to address real world problems of human and environmental pollution. This is accomplished through analyses of several case studies that have involved university research in environmental toxicology. These include litigations to limit human exposures to pollutants and regulatory actions to limit discharges of contaminants into surface waters in California. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### 135. Biological Chemistry of the Elements.

Examines, from a biological point of view, how the chemistry of elements is played out by a cell and identifies chemical and biological factors that govern a cell's selection of certain elements for biological reactions and processes. The goal is to inspire students, particularly the chemistry major, to learn and take cues from cells to appreciate and explore the beauty of chemistry. Prerequisite(s): Biology 100 or Chemistry 103 or Biochemistry 100A or equivalent.

#### 138. Biology of Disease.

Primary objective is to provide an understanding of disease processes in humans. Integrates normal physiology and pathophysiology with the molecular and physiologic bases of diseases. Major emphasis on the physiological, molecular, and biochemical basis of diseases with particular emphasis on the neuromuscular, cardiovascular, respiratory, renal, immune, and central nervous systems. Addresses environmental risk factors in the etiology of diseases. Overviews provided, but covers selective topics considered most important in depth. Prerequisite(s): Biology 20A and 20B or 21A and 21B and 100 or Biochemistry 100A. *Cell Biology* and *Human Physiology* recommended.

#### Film and Digital Media

#### 171E. The Structure of Hollywood.

Examines the current structure of the American film industry, tracing the history of shifting industrial practices. Who has power in Hollywood? How does the exercise of power affect the creative process? How does it change what we see? Enrollment restricted to sophomore, junior, and senior film and digital media majors.

#### History

#### 88F. Race and Ethnicity in America: Comparative Conceptions (2 credits).

An introduction to the persistence and change in the comparative/historical field of race and ethnic relations. The general assumption, around which this course is organized, is that race and ethnicity are two of the most fundamental aspects of American history. Enrollment limited to 20. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### 88G. San Francisco History (2 credits).

Focused on San Francisco, the course begins with native society and proceeds to examine the urban structure; ethnic histories; and the political, labor, and cultural movements that have distinguished the city.

Weekly reading, a film, a small project, and two Saturday field trips. Enrollment limited to 20. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

### 117C. What Is a Nation? The U.S. from 1877 to 1914.

History of the U.S. during what was perhaps its most socially turbulent era, the period right after Reconstruction to the First World War. What did it mean to be a nation in the post-Civil War era? How did a country that had only recently unified itself under one system of labor now resolve the question of national identity? Was America truly a nation by 1914?

#### 196N. Women and War.

Seminar examines the role of women in war, both as combatants and as noncombatants. It commences with a discussion of theories of war and gendered aspects of combat. It covers a wide historical range beginning with the "legendary" Amazons and ending with the rescue of Private First Class Jessica Lynch. Prerequisite(s): two upper-division history courses; satisfaction of Subject A and Composition requirements. Enrollment limited to 20. (General Education Code: W.)

#### History of Art and Visual Culture

#### 88A. How to Interpret a Portrait (2 credits).

How to interpret portraits done in European and North American traditions from ancient Romans to present. Many media considered—sculpture, painting, drawing, and photography. Learn to discern conventions that recur and undergo modification. Family photographs are one of the topics covered. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

## 80S. Western Culture and the Human Visual Imagination.

Survey of critical themes and theoretical topics central to historical situations and visual character of Western culture from Early Modern period to present. Addresses issues of particular concern to the visual tradition in Europe and the U.S.: the beginning and end of art, visual regimes of looking and seeing, the idea of the artist, the art market, media and technologies, the role of museums and other exhibition practices. (General Education Codes: T5-Humanities and Arts or Social Sciences, A.)

# 105K. The Body in Crisis: Three Fin de Siècles. Examines changing representations of the body in art

at the turn of the nineteenth, twentieth, and twentyfirst centuries in Europe and North America. Topics include body as political metaphor and as a site for the construction of racial, ethnic, and gender identities. (General Education Code: A.)

#### 106D. Architecture as Visual Culture.

Focusing on designers who have challenged the boundaries of architecture through the incorporation of and experimentation with diverse media, including drawing, photography, film, and new media, this course examines architecture as a critical paradigm for visual culture. (General Education Code: A.)

### 1890. Mediterranean Cities in the Nineteenth and Twentieth Centuries.

A study of architecture and urban landscapes in cities including Casablanca, Barcelona, Algiers, Marseille, Athens, and Istanbul. Considers myths and realities of Mediterranean identity in architecture through drawings and buildings, photography, and film during colonial and postcolonial periods. Enrollment limited to 35. (General Education Code: A.)

#### 190F. Mountains and Religion in China.

Topical approach to the visual culture of mountains in Chinese history—encompassing both imaginative constructions and physical realities—especially in relation to religious practices. Considers examples and contexts in relation to such topics as pilgrimage, local and state religion, and individual or group retreat and reclusion. Prerequisite(s): a previous course on Chinese history or culture (in such departments as History of Art and Visual Culture, History, Literature, or Anthropology) or permission of instructor; instructor determines if prerequisite is met. Enrollment limited to 17. Enrollment restricted to juniors and seniors. (General Education Code: A.)

#### 191M. Manet, Painter of "Modern Life".

Focuses upon French artist, Édouard Manet (1832–1883), and his role in the history of the "modern" in representation. Oriented toward recent scholarship, seminar provides an examination of Manet's life and work and analyzes artistic historical constructions of his modernity. Enrollment limited to 17. Enrollment restricted to juniors and seniors. (General Education Code: A.)

#### **Information Systems Management**

#### 80C. Starting a New Technology Company.

Focuses on the creation and management of technology start-ups and small companies, using case studies and team projects as the basis for learning and applying the course materials. (General Education Codes: T7-Natural Sciences or Social Sciences, Q.)

#### 225. Management of Technology II.

High-technology enterprises must understand and operate effectively within their technology-business value chains in order to maximize profitability. Course develops and applies methods and tools for the design, optimization, selection, and management of these value chain networks. Students who receive credit for this course cannot also receive credit for either course 86 or 125. Prerequisite(s): course 205. Enrollment restricted to juniors, seniors, and graduate students.

# 250. Stochastic Optimization in Information Systems and Technology.

The first in a sequence of courses in information systems and technology management (ISTM). Provides systematic methodology and corresponding set of methods and analytical tools to address the field of ISTM in an integrated manner. Training in stochastic optimization and other algorithmic approaches, such as dynamic programming, required to achieve business intelligence in corporate enterprises. Students should have solid background in probability—equiva-

lent to statistics, stochastic methods, calculus, linear algebra, mathematical maturity, stochastic processes, and optimization. Prerequisite(s): Engineering 203 and 205 and Computer Engineering 230 recommended. Enrollment restricted to graduate students; undergraduates may enroll if they have completed Computer Engineering 107 or Engineering 131 or have permission of instructor. May be repeated for credit.

#### **Legal Studies**

#### 113. Gay Rights and the Law.

Examines relevant court cases as well as local, state, and federal laws that define boundaries for legal recognition of sexual orientation and personal sexuality. Explores legal assumptions behind current and historical cases defining personal sexuality and sexual orientation and considers the social and political impetus in each era that drove the courts and legislatures to make such decisions. Enrollment restricted to legal studies majors during priority enrollment only.

#### Linguistics

#### 88C. Symbolic Systems and Codes (2 credits).

A study and analysis of symbolic systems and their interpretations. Students learn about progressively more sophisticated methods of encoding and decoding information. Topics covered include ancient and modern writing systems, hieroglyphics, computer languages, encryption and decryption, and ciphers and codes. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### Literature

#### 88E. Dombey and Son (1 credit).

Close study of Dickens's seventh novel (and one of his greatest), *Dombey and Son*. Students read the novel over the course of the quarter in short segments that approximate the novel's original serial installments. Students also consult selected biographical and critical commentary. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### 88F. Reading Holocaust Writing (1 credit).

Focuses on Primo Levi's Survival in Auschwitz and Anne Michaels's Fugitive Pieces. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

# Pre- and Early Modern Literary Studies 124. Hebrew Bible.

An introduction to textual, source, redaction, historical, and literary criticism of individual books of the Hebrew Bible to exegesis as science and ideology. Also studies texts and iconography of neighboring mythological traditions (Mesopotamian, Ugaritic, Egyptian, and Greek) when appropriate. Topic for spring: Genesis.

#### World Literature and Cultural Studies

#### 129. Deconstructing Globalization.

The idea of globalization has become the major cultural, political, and economical issue in the world today—promoted, criticized, or rejected. The objective is to analyze this idea in order to evaluate its pre-

suppositions and its pertinence. Enrollment limited to 25. Enrollment restricted to juniors and seniors.

#### **Mathematics**

## 88B. Mathematics and Mathematicians in Hollywood (2 credits).

View films like *Contact, A Beautiful Mind, Rain Man, Proof* (Nova Series on PBS), and others where mathematics and mathematicians appear. Discussions focus on the scientific aspects of these films and their relation to contemporary mathematics and science. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### Music

#### 801. Music of Modern Israel.

A study of musical, historical, and sociological factors shaping the development of Israel's contemporary art music including influences of traditional Middle Eastern Jewish and Arabic/Turkish musical culture on western orientations. Enrollment limited to 40. (General Education Codes: T4-Humanities and Arts, A, E.)

#### 80Y. The Music of Bob Dylan.

In-depth exploration of Bob Dylan's music and lyrics focusing both on their artistic value and their significant influences on the development of popular music. Musical contemporaries, historical and cultural context, and biographical information enrich the story. Prerequisite(s): course 80H, *American Popular Music*, recommended but not required. (General Education Codes: T4-Humanities and Arts, A.)

#### 88C. Sound Art (2 credits).

Lectures from faculty and visiting composers introduce diverse styles of contemporary composition, represented in the 2004 April in Santa Cruz Festival of New Music. Students learn to create and perform contemporary compositions using graphic music notation and instruments/voices at hand. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

### 88D. Introduction to Music through Literature (2 credits).

A close reading of Thomas Mann's *Doctor Faustus* reveals both a magical novel about a great composer and (by *listening* to music Mann discussed) introduces the main styles of western music from medieval times through the early twentieth century. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### **Ocean Sciences**

## 88A. In Deep Water: The World's Oceans Today (2 credits).

Exploration of scientific issues about state of the oceans using recent reports about the oceans and U.S. ocean policy as foundation for inquiry. Seminar format focusing on three to five topics in depth each quarter. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### Philosophy

#### 88C. Science and Religion (1 credit).

Investigates various positions on the relation of sci-

ence and religion. Enrollment limited to 22. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### 120. Philosophical Writing.

Training in philosophical thinking and its expression in written form. Prerequisite(s): course 11, 22, 24, or 26; satisfaction of Subject A and Composition requirements. Enrollment limited to 30. Enrollment restricted to philosophy majors. (General Education Code: W.)

#### 138. Rational Decision Theory.

When the alarm clock rings in the morning, the question arises: Do I want to get up? You have to make a decision. Further questions come up: What shall I wear for the day? How shall I plan the day? Decision making is part of every day life. Moreover, one doesn't want to make bad decisions, so everyone wants to know (at least in principle) how one should decide rationally. We look at (a) cardinal utility and subjective probability, (b) different maximizing principles, (c) Newcomb's problem and the prisoner's dilemma, (d) Nash and correlated equilibrium concepts, (e) dynamic choice theory, and (f) the connection between decision theory and game theory. Prerequisite(s): one philosophy course.

190U. Wittgenstein's Philosophical Investigations. Consists of a close study of Ludwig Wittgenstein's Philosophical Investigations. Enrollment limited to 20. Enrollment restricted to junior and senior philosophy majors.

#### 232. Advanced Topics in Value Theory.

Considers topics central to contemporary philosophy ethics: justification, normativity, diversity, skepticism, relativism, rationality, motivation, obligation, responsibility, emotion, and so forth. In some instances, the investigation proceeds through readings by historical figures such as Wollaston and Cudworth. Enrollment limited to 20. Enrollment restricted to graduate philosophy majors.

#### **Politics**

#### 178. U.S. Foreign Economic Policy.

Theoretical and historical survey of U.S. foreign economic policy. First part explores theoretical frameworks and covers historical events in the U.S.'s relationship with world economy. The second part focuses on postwar foreign economic policy; surveys different theoretical approaches to U.S. foreign policy; and examines fundamental developments and issues in trade, monetary, development, and investment policies. Enrollment restricted to politics and Latin American and Latino studies/politics combined majors during priority enrollment only.

#### **Psychology**

#### 100A. Language Socialization.

Language is a social tool used by speakers to create and recreate social worlds in ways that reflect and shape cultural norms, values, and ideologies. This course explores how human beings become competent members of their linguistic community/ies. Satisfies seminar requirement. Enrollment limited to 20.

Enrollment restricted to senior psychology, anthropology, and linguistics majors.

#### 100H. Symbolic Development.

Drawing on research in psychology and art education, examines the development of symbolic understanding. Readings cover a range of symbol systems with a particular focus on visual images such as photographs and drawings. Satisfies seminar requirement. Enrollment limited to 20. Enrollment restricted to senior psychology majors.

#### 100W. Children's Understanding of Irony.

The concept of irony has been discussed and debated since Aristotle, yet there still is confusion about what it is. Discusses how children develop an understanding of this difficult concept and why it is an important understanding to have. In addition, examines the role of culture, family, and region in developing an understanding of irony. Satisfies seminar requirement. Enrollment limited to 30. Enrollment restricted to senior psychology majors.

#### 235. Infant Development in Contexts.

Seminar on how contextual factors influence the development in infancy, especially on cognitive domains. Discusses at least four types of contextual factors: cultural, experiential, event, and interpersonal contexts. Enrollment restricted to graduate psychology majors.

#### Sociology

#### 122A. Sociology of Punishment.

Traces evolution of American state punishment from its pre-prison days to the current Super-Max Security Housing Units, with an eye along the way to revealing punishment's changing social/cultural meanings. Punishment is not just instrumental, but expressive. It is at once an artifact of American society's cultural forms and itself a determinant of culture. Enrollment limited to 45. Enrollment restricted to junior and senior sociology majors.

#### Women's Studies

## 42J. Student-Directed Seminar: Unlocking Incarceration: A Feminist Perspective.

Introduces aspects of women's incarceration in the U.S. from a feminist perspective, including prisons as method of social control; the prison industrial complex; political prisoners; the war on drugs; racial, gender, and class profiling; domestic violence and imprisonment; physical and emotional violence; medical neglect; pregnancy; activism and healing from the inside; life after prison; and organizing around prisons. Enrollment limited to 15. Enrollment restricted to first-year students and sophomores.

#### 181. Slavery/Emancipation.

The historical study of race and gender is central to our understanding of America's past—as well as its stratified and troubled present. Exploring how systems of racialized gender are mobilized and consolidated in periods of political instability sheds light on how the status quo is maintained. Examines how race creates and shapes gender and how gender creates and shapes race by focusing on the history of slavery and emancipation. Provides a foundation for understand-

ing the central role of African American women in the history, culture, and politics in the U.S. Prerequisite(s): History 143A, African American History to 1877, recommended. Enrollment limited to 20. (General Education Code: E.)

#### 232. Topics in Postcolonial Studies.

Variable topics that could include postcolonial approaches to questions of epistemology and knowledge production, theories of nationalism and nationstate formation, subaltern historiography, analyses of modernization and developmental theory, postcolonial approaches to globalization, and transnationalism. Significant component of feminist contributions to these literatures. Topic for 2003-04: Nations, Nationalisms, and States. Examines important theories and debates on nations and nationalisms as cultural and political movements. Includes literature that addresses historical emergence of nations as well as work that considers current interstate system in the context of globalization. Particular attention to how colonialism is situated and understood within different analytical frameworks. Enrollment limited to 15. Enrollment restricted to graduate students.
